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

This instrument is designed to collect information about activities conducted by community partners for the Strategic Prevention Framework State Incentive Grant (SPF SIG) Initiative. This information will be collected every 6 months, with a select number of questions being asked only once throughout the life of the grant.

The CLI is designed as a two-part survey. Part I collects data about the community partner's progress through the strategic prevention framework. Part II collects information about the specific intervention(s) being implemented by the community partner. The community partner will complete a separate Part II form for each intervention implemented. For example, if the community is implementing a participant-based intervention classified as a prevention education strategy and another intervention classified as an environmental strategy, they will complete two Part II forms. Data collected from the survey will be used to evaluate the effectiveness of the SPF SIG.

Each community partner will be assigned a unique numerical identification. This identification number will be used to ensure that communities cannot be identified by name. In addition, no individuals will be identified in the reporting of results.

Make sure to read all of the directions and examples, which are provided in *italics*.

Directions for skipping questions are indicated where appropriate to minimize the time needed to complete the questionnaire. This web-based survey is designed to automatically take you to the appropriate question, but you should still follow the directions closely.
