## PROCESSING NOTES FOR ICPSR #3210

*Eurobarometer 54LAN: Special Survey on Languages, December 2000*

- 1) Some of the variables in this collection have a large amount of values. When tabulating these variables in Stata (Windows and Linux), an error message “too many values” appears.

To prevent this error message, the *tab1* command can be run using ranges of values specified after the *if* statement.

e.g., *tab1 VAR1 if VAR1>0 & VAR1<=45000*

*tab1 VAR1 if VAR1>4500 & VAR1<=100000*

In addition, the command *bigtab* can be used (e.g., *bigtab VAR1*), but in Windows only. It is available via download by typing the Stata command line *ssc install bigtab*. (*bigtab* Author: Paul H. Bern, Princeton University.)

- 2) The documentation and/or setup files may contain references to Norway, but Norway was not a participant in this wave of Eurobarometer surveys. This collection contains no data for Norway.
- 3) “Technical Specifications” for this collection were not provided by the data producer. For reference, the number of interviews and fieldwork dates for each country in accordance with the data are listed below:

- 4) D8/V496-V497: For three respondents “Age when stopped full-time education” indicated a value which was too high for their age (D11/V499); these cases are coded to ‘0’ (“NA”) in V496 and V497. Six missing cases (“SYSMIS”) in D8/V496 which are coded ‘2’ (“Student”) in D15a/V502 have been recoded to ‘98’ (“Still studying”) in V496 and ‘10’ (“Still studying”) in V497.
- 5) No data are made available for P7\_FRA (NUTS II/Region I) for France.
- 6) Questionnaire routing for Q1B is not consistently specified in all national field questionnaires; consequently, the filter was not applied for data processing. Respondents who neither mention a first, second nor third foreign language, may for example have mentioned a fourth language.

## **WEIGHTING INFORMATION FOR ICPSR #3210**

*Eurobarometer 54LAN: Special Survey on Languages, December 2000*

For each country a comparison between the sample and universe was carried out for internal weighting purposes. The universe description is made available by the National Research Institutes and/or by EUROSTAT. On this basis a national weighting procedure, using marginal and intercellular weighting, is applied. As such in all countries, minimum sex, age, region NUTS II (basic regions as defined by the EUROSTAT nomenclature of territorial units for statistics), and size of locality are introduced in the iteration procedure

Five national weight variables are provided for use in separate analysis of individual countries:

**WEIGHT RESULT FROM TARGET** reproduces the real number of cases for each country. British and Northern Irish as well as East and West German samples are weighted separately. This weight corresponds to former NATION WEIGHT II.

**WEIGHT ADJUSTED TO STANDARD SIZE** is equivalent to WEIGHT RESULT FROM TARGET adjusting all samples to the standard size of 1000 cases (respectively 300 for Northern Ireland and 600 for Luxembourg).

**WEIGHT SPECIAL UNITED KINGDOM** adjusts the British and the Northern Irish samples to their respective proportions in the United Kingdom and should be used whenever the United Kingdom is to be analyzed as a whole. All national weights are included.

**WEIGHT SPECIAL GERMANY** adjusts the East and the West German samples to their respective proportions in the united Germany. All national weights are included. This weight should be used whenever the united Germany is to be analyzed as a whole.

**WEIGHT SPECIAL GERMANY & UNITED KINGDOM** adjusts the East and the West German samples, AND the British and Northern Irish samples to their respective proportions in the united Germany and the United Kingdom. All national weights are included. This weight should be used whenever both, the united Germany and the United Kingdom are to be analyzed as a whole.

The European weight variables include adjustments of each national sample in proportion to its share in the total population of the European Community, ages 15 and over. These post-stratification adjustments are based on population figures published by EUROSTAT in the Regional Statistics Yearbook. The European weights include the national weighting factors.

European weights are provided for use in analyses of the European Community as a whole and in accordance with its historical composition:

**WEIGHT EURO 15** includes the new member countries Austria, Sweden, and Finland;

**WEIGHT EURO 12** includes the twelve member countries;

**WEIGHT EUROPE 12 +** adds East Germany;

**WEIGHT EURO 10** excludes Spain and Portugal;

**WEIGHT EURO 9** in addition excludes Greece.

**WEIGHT EURO 6** only refers to the six EC founder members: France, Belgium, Netherlands, West Germany, Italy, and Luxembourg.

**WEIGHT EUROPE + 3** only refers to the three new members Finland, Sweden, and Austria (all other countries are excluded).

**WEIGHT SPECIAL EURO/NON-EURO (GREECE NON-EURO)** separates the 11 countries which accepted to introduce the EURO, as of 01/01/99 (Belgium, Germany, Spain, France, Ireland, Italy, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Austria, Portugal, and Finland);

A split variable for the application participating/not participating countries is available; the variable V553 defines the separate groups.

**WEIGHT SPECIAL EURO/NON-EURO (GREECE EURO)** includes Greece into the group of EURO countries;

A split variable for the application participating/not participating countries is available; the variable V554 defines the separate groups.
