STUDY DESCRIPTION

This study contains data for 14 specialized agencies of the U.N. Thirteen variables include age of organization, number of members, total expenditures, expenditures in various areas, contributions, structure of organization, frequency of assembly, number of regional offices, number of non-governmental organizations affiliated and staff characteristics. Data are for 1966.

ORGANIZATIONAL CHARACTERISTICS OF UN SPECIALIZED AGENCIES

Data have been collected from Organizational Characteristics of UN Specialized Agencies (1966) for the IAEA and 13 specialized agencies. The unit of analysis is the agency. Among the 12 variables presented for each agency are age of agency, number of members, total expenditures, percentage of regular budget assessed to the largest contributor and number of regional offices.
